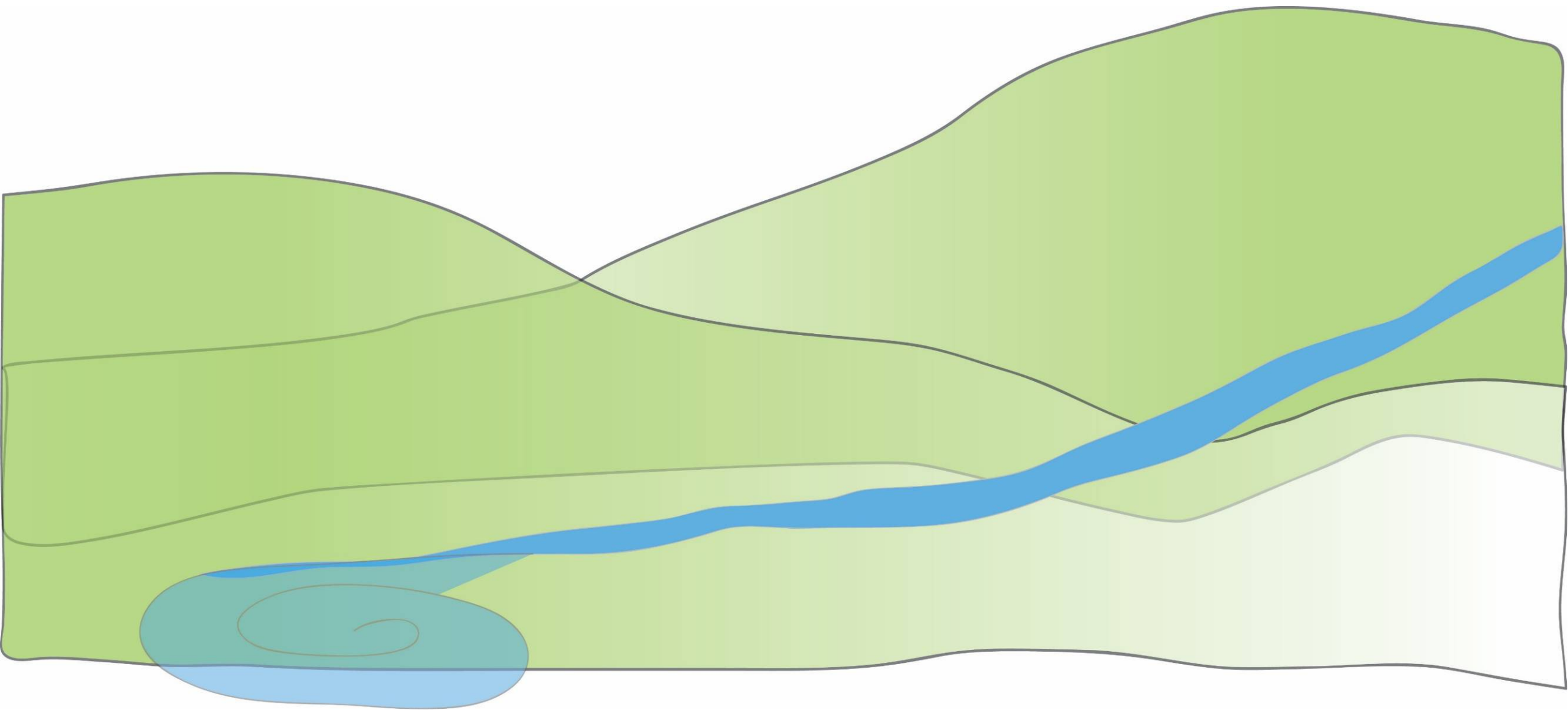


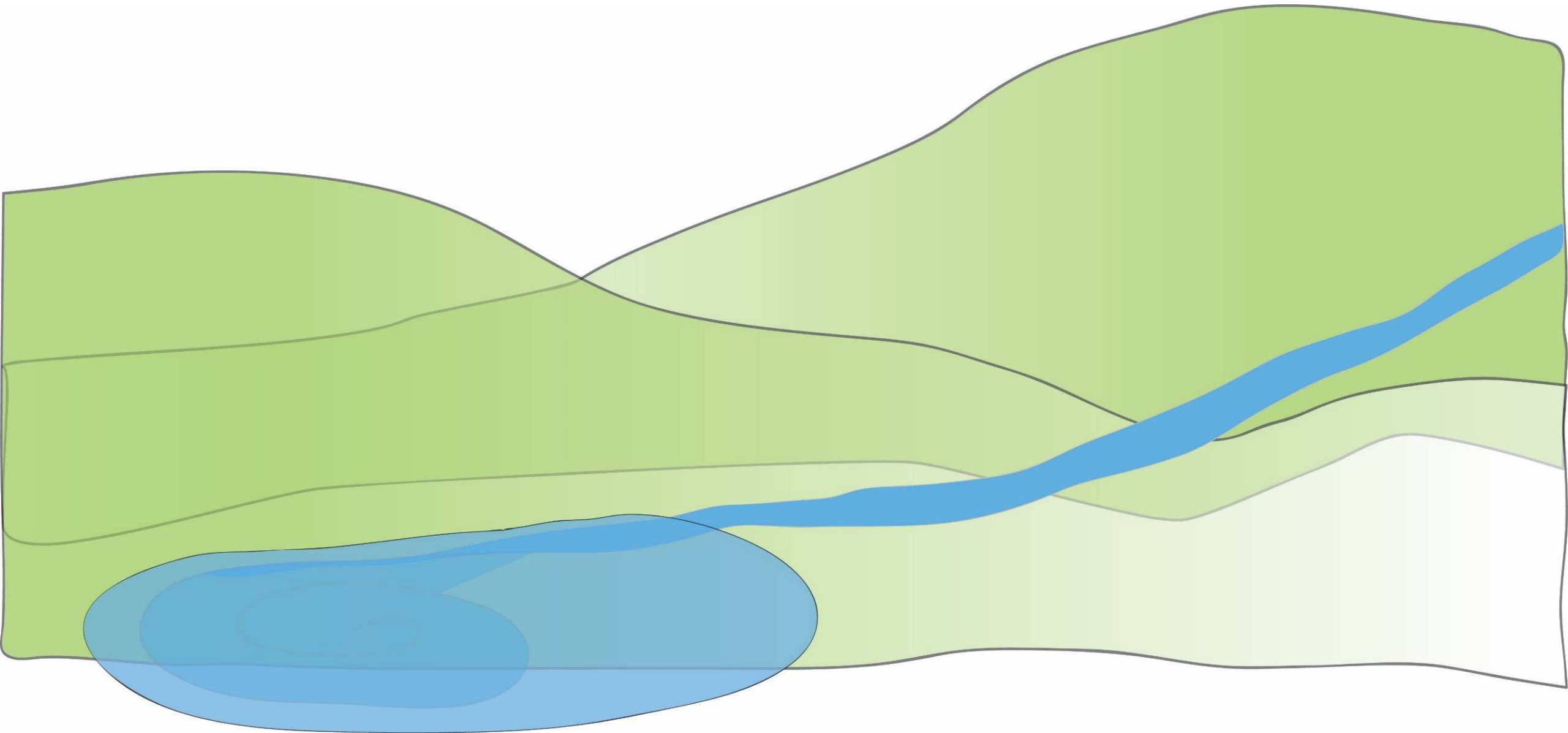
1. Landscape: the starting point



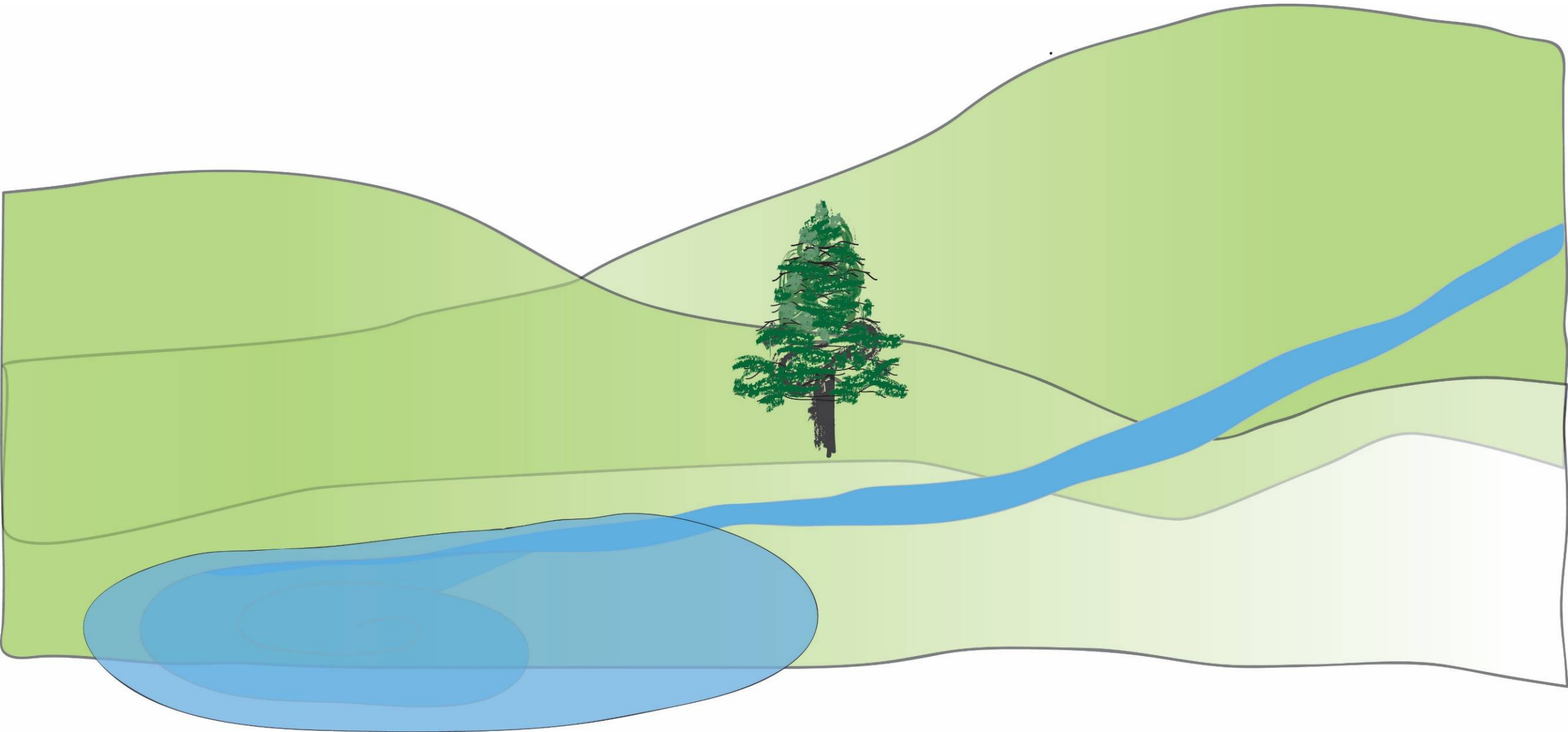
Landscape includes water courses and drainage



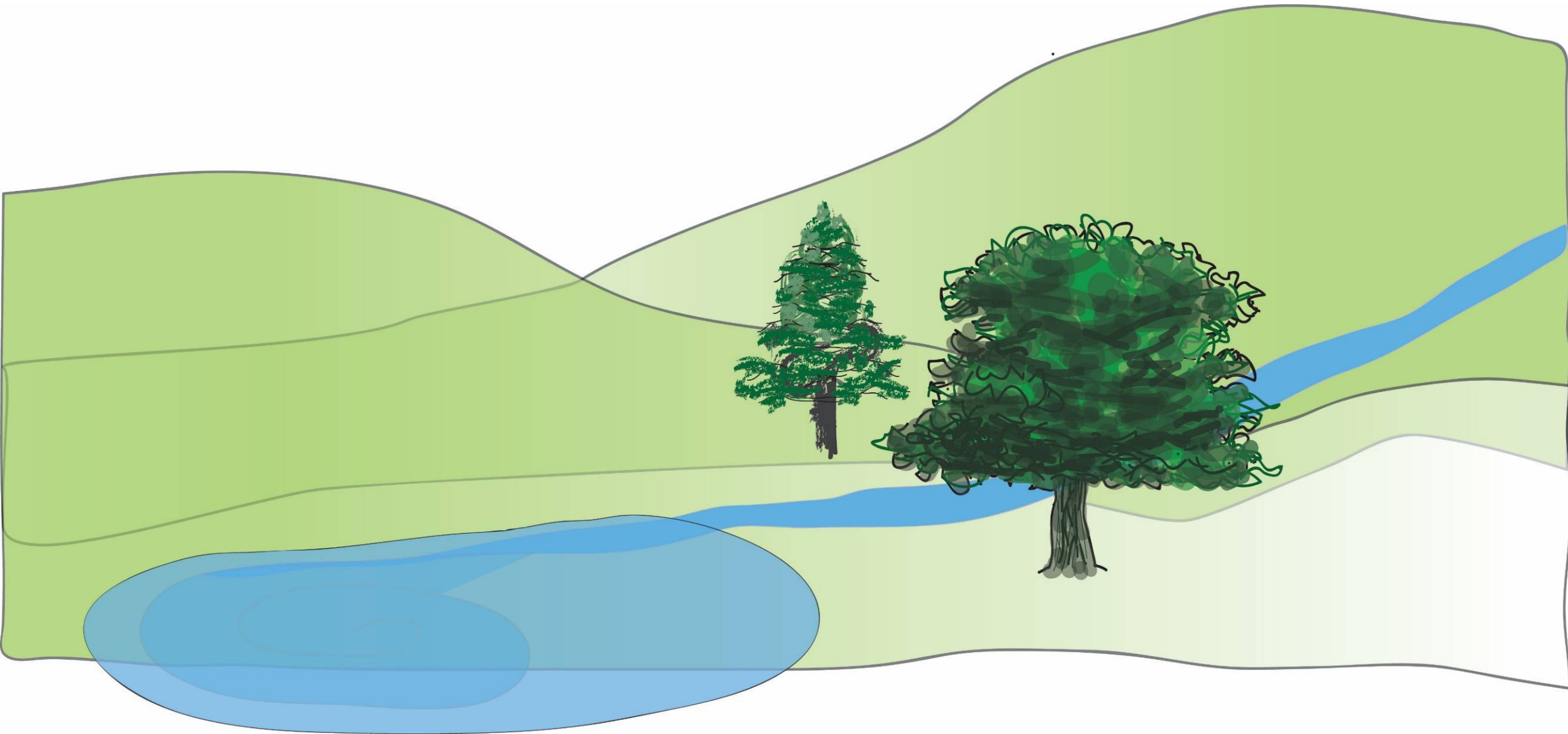
Water was important in deciding where to start a settlement



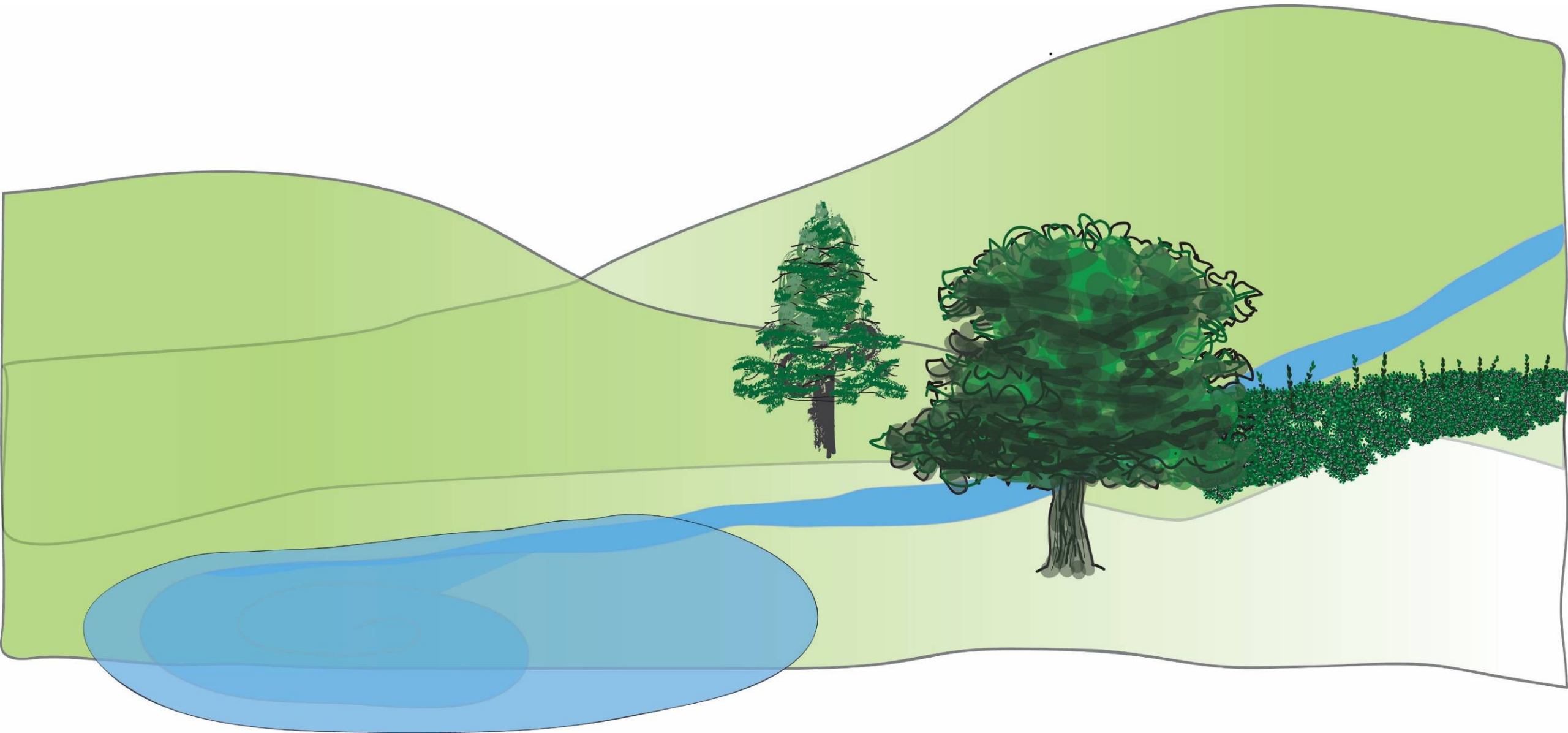
Landscape also includes trees, forests and woodlands



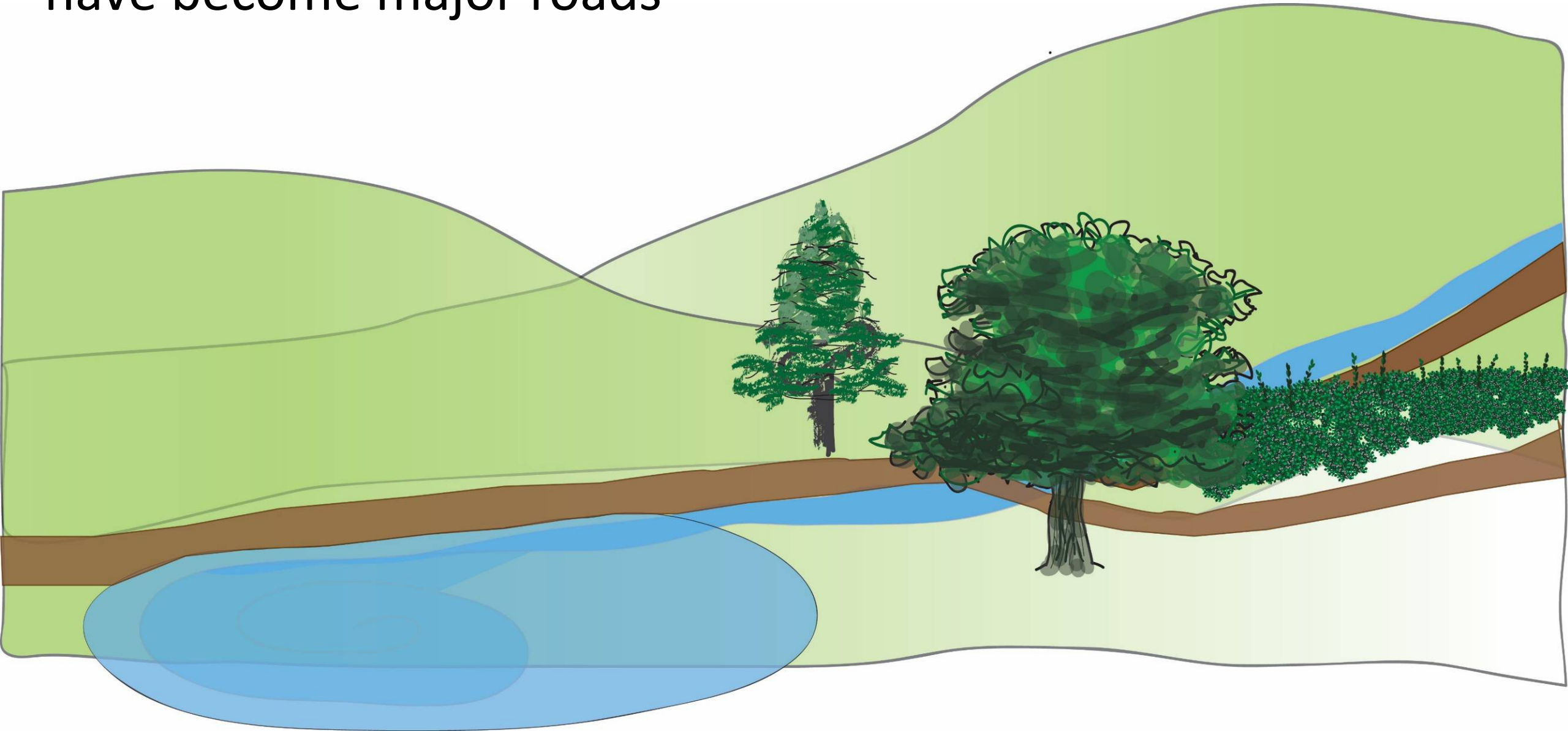
Some trees mark ancient field patterns or boundaries



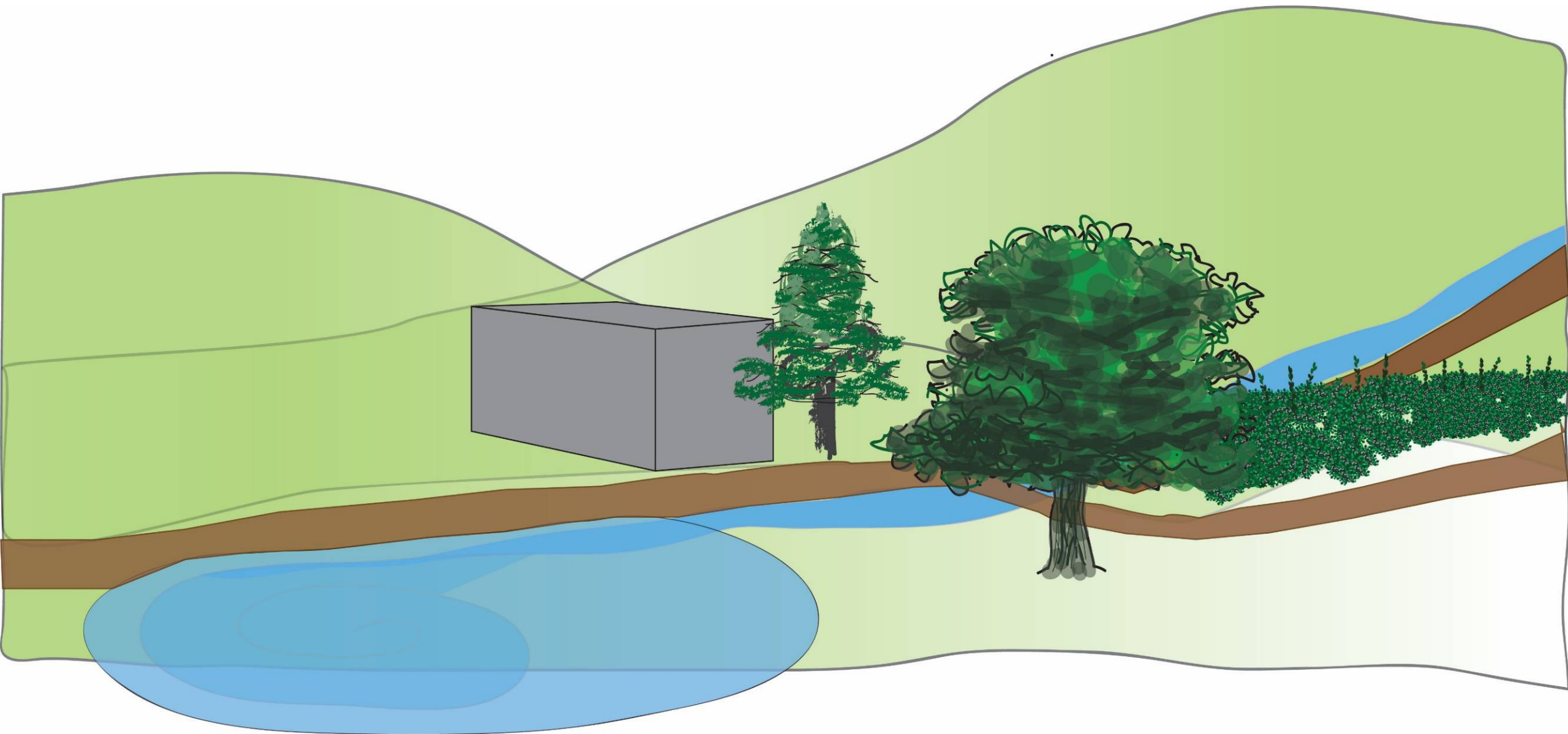
Native hedgerows can provide connectivity for creatures



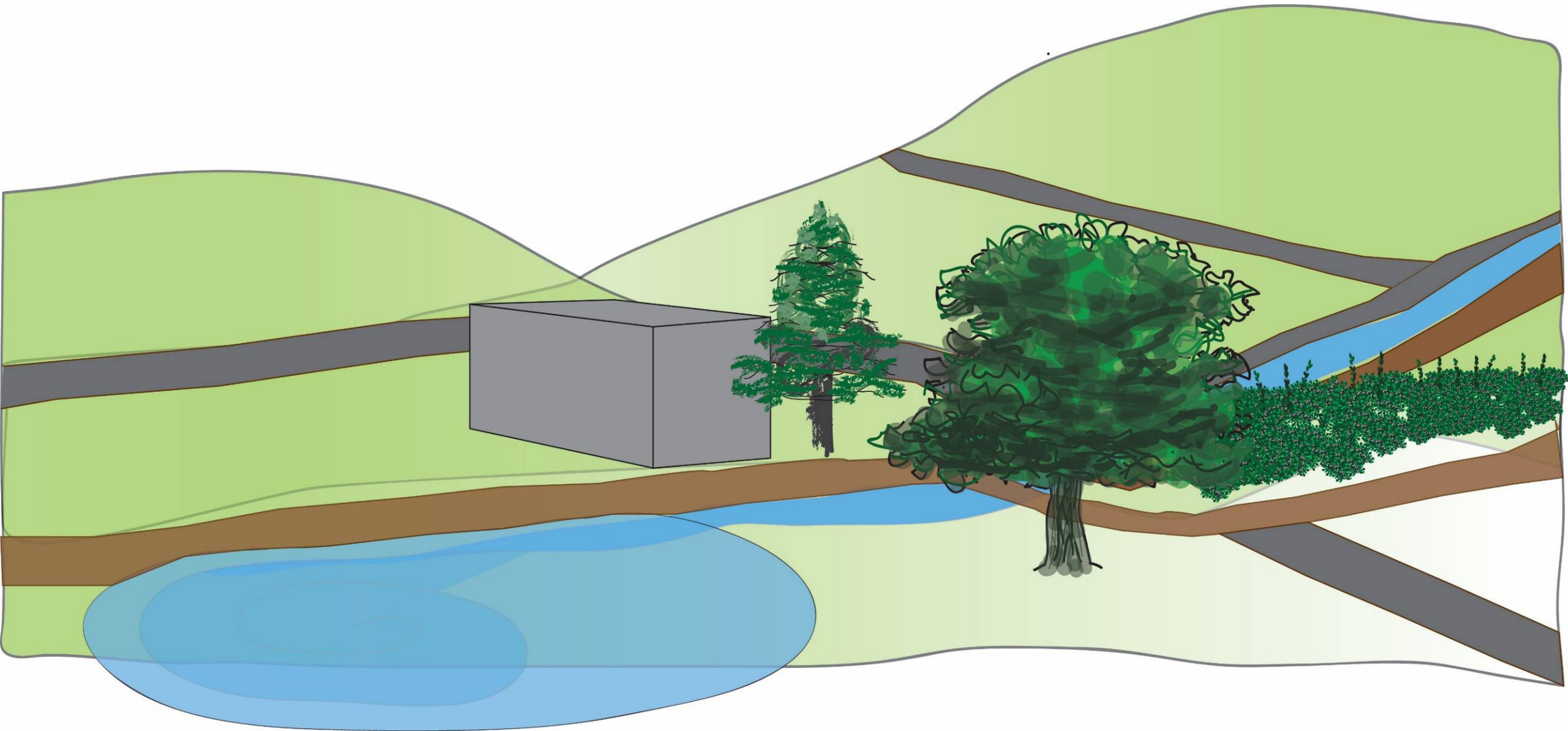
2. Historic routes: some remain as quiet footpaths, some have become major roads



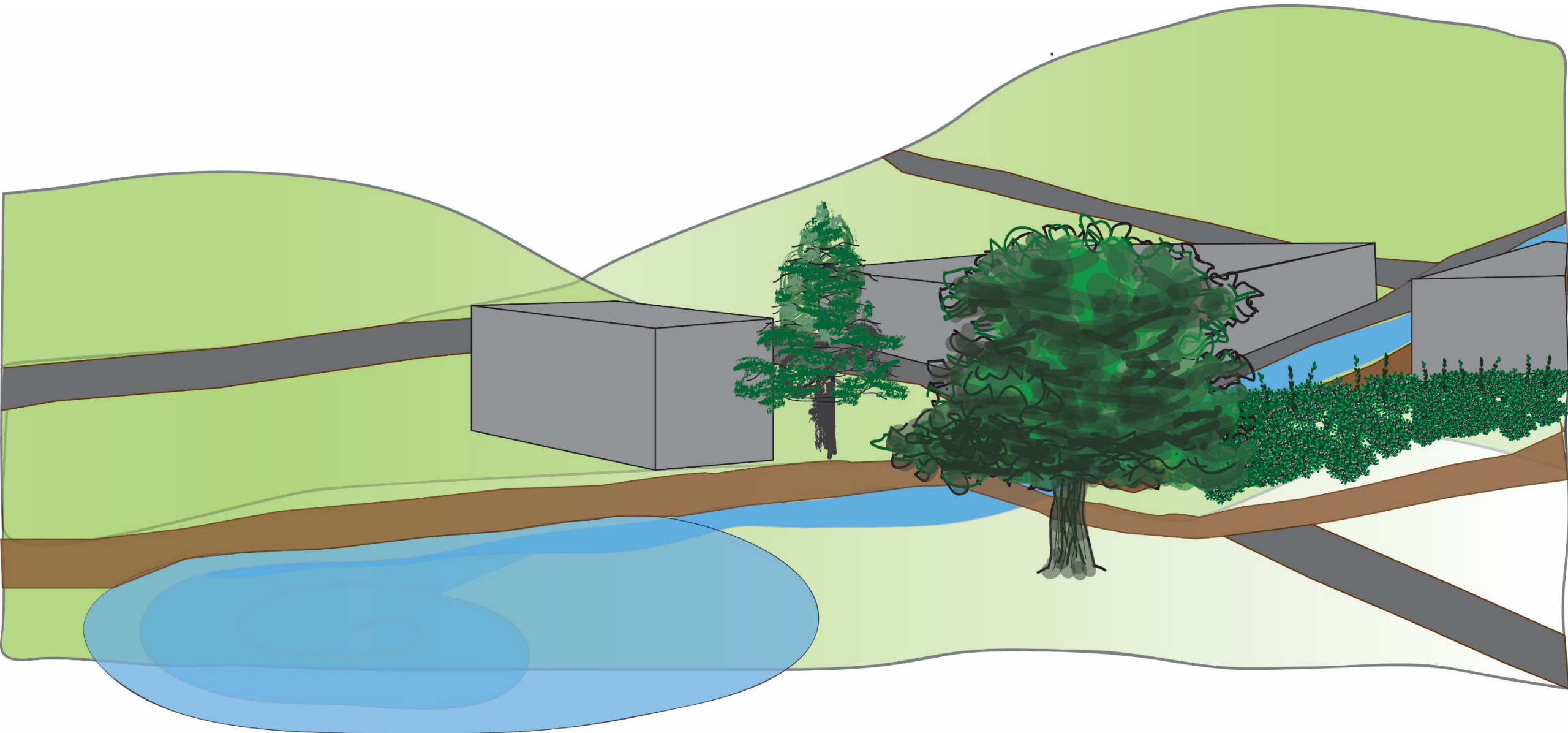
3. The first block of a settlement appears



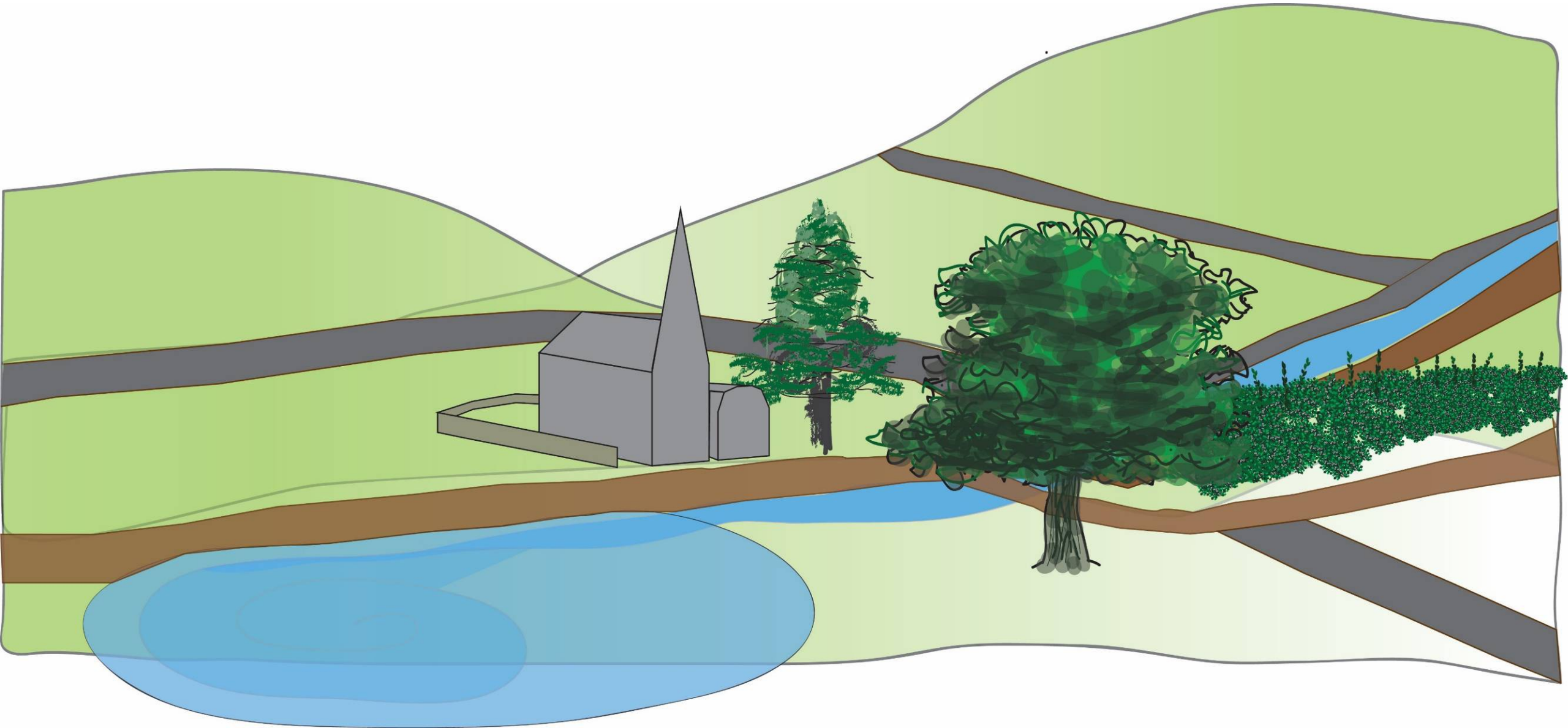
4. New roads are created
