As a follow-up to the community **litter** picking day earlier in the year, Parish Councillors have met with the manager of McDonalds in Petersfield and arranged for the company to do some litter-picking in the parish and to work with Buriton School on an anti-litter campaign. Please help to keep the parish free from litter by taking all litter home or disposing of it in any of the bins provided.

Dog poo is again a problem in parts of the parish – and can be dangerous for children. All the litter bins around the village can be used for dog waste as long as it is sealed in a bag. The District Council reminds everyone that it is an offence not clean up after dogs and that Fines and Fixed Penalty Notices can be issued. Please do not leave any dog poo anywhere – and if you have put it into a bag, then please put it into a bin. There is no magic dog-poo fairy to pick up bags left in the countryside!

The Parish Council continues to study all **planning applications** in the parish and to submit comments to the Planning Authority – and we are also continuing to try to get motorised vehicles removed from some of our lovely **Rights of Way**. We are currently considering challenging a recent decision by Hampshire County Council by mounting an Appeal to the Government's Planning Inspectors.
