Naturum bought the land off Greenway Lane near Buriton from a local family who had owned it since 2006.

The land immediately adjoins the Queen Elizabeth Country Park and is opposite the Butser Hill SSSI.

ENABLING SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Naturum operate a portfolio of nature recovery projects within the Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG) framework.

BNG was established in 2024 to ensure that all new development not only offsets its impact on biodiversity but actually leads to an overall improvement of 10% post development.

This can either be delivered on-site, which can prove difficult, or off-site on legally secured and registered land where the levels of biodiversity are being improved.

These are known as BNG Habitat Banks and Buriton Meadows will be the first to be delivered in East Hampshire with the hope that it can offset development in towns such as Alton, Bordon and Liphook.

Our plans for the site include:

Planting of a traditional orchard adjacent to the railway line and Greenway Lane,
Reintroduction of lost hedgerows between the fields and road,
Planting of wildflower meadows,
Replication of the very rare Lowland Calcerous Grassland found on Butser Hill,
Extending the Lowland Mixed Deciduous Woodland areas.

The above have been designed to be sympathetic to the local area and to improve the levels of biodiversity on site but to also benefit the local wildlife populations.

These improvements will be carried out over the next year or so and will be legally secured for a period of 30 years.
